

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RATHCOOLE YOUTH FORUM




After many months of group meetings, the Rathcoole Youth Forum has successfully completed a Good Relations OCN, organised numerous community fundraising events and completed a visit to Krakow, Poland (Thank you all for your support!)

During our time there we had the opportunity to explore the beautiful city, get underground and visit the Wieliczka Salt Mines aswell as some reflection time during a very emotional experience at the Auschwitz Concentration Camp.

To say the group embraced this experience would be an understatement, one young person couldn't understand why anyone would leave this beautiful city to come to Northern Ireland unless it was their only option, this trip left plenty to be grateful for and appreciate what a privilege it is to be a part of this generation: as noted in Auschwitz 'the one who does not remember history is bound to live through it again'

With the support from CRAIC NI, Polish Group the young people came back from Poland and presented their experiences to their peers at a session in the Dunanney Centre. It was the hope the Youth Forum could share their learning and help to motivate their peers to also get active in their local communities. It is hoped that young people can be a part of positive change and the Youth Forum recognises that this also comes with responsibilities. Going forward the group wants to look at 3 main themes: local volunteer opportunities, further engagement and support for their peers and also to establish links with youth from multi-cultural backgrounds. This next stage of the group's journey begins with members undertaking an OCN level 2 in Peer Leadership and running a number of initiatives over the summer months ahead... watch this space!!! Newtownabbey Family Hub

The Newtownabbey Family Hub meets once per month to look at the best ways of offering family support to those families most in need in the Newtownabbey Area. Referrals to the hub are made by a range of agencies and also self referrals. Some families are struggling with home life on a daily basis and need a bit of extra help. The Family Hub is made up of a range of partners who can step in and offer support which prevents issues escalating to such an extent that social services, PSNI or courts have to intervene. The hub is managed by Action for Children and re-

cial workers and self referrals.

Start360's new EDGES service has just become operational in the Newtownabbey area. Funded by the Early Intervention and Transformation Programme, EDGES will provide early intervention services for young people, primarily between the ages of 13 - 17, who are on the edge of care, custody and/or education. The service also operates in the Enniskillen area.

EDGES is aimed at young people who are coming to the regular attention of the Police and/or whose attendance or behaviour in education indicates a need for intervention. They are also likely to be at risk of homelessness in later adolescence and to feature in the Not in Employment, Education or Training (NEETS) population post-compulsory school education.

The young person must be referred by a member of the Local Implementation/Operation Team - contact

Start360 for more details on how this works. The criteria for referral are:

Young people aged 13 – 17

Young people living in defined pilot areas

Young people and their family willing to engage

Risk of family breakdown – e.g. having to leave the home/care/custody/homeless

Young people presenting with challenging behaviour and/or multiple issues (e.g. mental health issues, drug/alcohol issues, family instability/breakdown/school exclusion/behaviour)

Young people at risk of committing further offences and/or entering custody
