

Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network Privacy Notice

We are collecting information from you for the purposes of Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network Directory of Services. The directory will collate details of organisations (statutory, community, voluntary, businesses and individuals) providing services to address loneliness in the borough e.g. befriending, luncheon clubs, senior citizen groups, youth groups etc. The directory will be available in hard copy and online. This is in accordance with Section 6 1 (e) of the General Data Protection Regulations – processing is necessary for a task in the public interest. Information collected may be shared with members of the Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network and to other third parties (including individuals, statutory, community, voluntary and businesses) to meet their requests. Information will not be transferred to countries outside the EEA. All information collected and processed may be subject to audit. The Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network may also process the information for research purposes carried out in the public interest. All information will be held securely within the Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network and will be disposed of securely when the Antrim and Newtownabbey Loneliness Network ceases to exist.
